Dear Parents & Carers,

This week we finally seem to be getting somewhere with reducing our Covid numbers, which I know will please Year 4 who will be able to have lunch at the normal time again. Thank you to everyone that has supported us in keeping the measures in place, this is what has made it work.

We will be continuing to encourage parents to wear masks on-site and saying that any visitors coming into the building are wearing a mask (unless you are exempt), we will continue to practice good hand hygiene and to have remote assemblies. Clubs will again be able to mix year groups, unless there is an individual case within that year group. I can hear the cheer from parents and children from here as you read this.

One of the areas that we are looking to develop at Ashtree is positive playground behaviours. You may have heard about 'Lego Club' or 'Colouring Club' from your child at home. I want to take the opportunity now to explain our plans and my vision over the next year. As a teacher it is important to understand that the noisy, hustle and bustle of the playground doesn't suit everyone. It can be overwhelming for some and for others they become overexcited. One fantastic idea that Mr Yates and I have picked up from talking to other schools, is to have a calming indoor activity as an alternative for those that find the playground environment difficult. To help to facilitate that in the first instance, class teachers have been identifying those children that we think will benefit from some time indoors completing mindfulness and problem-solving activities. They have then been invited to join in those activities for all or part of their lunchtime. The aim is not to keep them in all of the time, it is just as important to get outside into the fresh air, but to give them the moment of quiet that they need or the chance to mix and form friendships in smaller groups.

You may have noticed the adverts for an MSA role recently, we will be interviewing next week and employing some MSAs that will be trained to run these clubs and offer more variety in the activities. It is important to me that we offer opportunities for all of the children, not just those that like to run around and also to support those who find it difficult to control their behaviours in learning new strategies. If you would like to know more about this, please do talk to me or to Mr Yates.

Finally, one of our longer-term projects is to source funding for automatic gates at the front of the school. You may have noticed that between certain times of day the gates are closed, and the main gate locked. This is helping to increase the security of the site but at the same time makes it more difficult for deliveries and visitors to enter school without calling up to the office first. I apologise for the inconvenience in the shorter term. If anyone knows of a source of funding for projects like this, we would love to hear about it. We will keep you updated on our quest for automated gates and an intercom, thank you for your patience in the meantime.

Have a lovely weekend, I hope that the predicted snow and wind doesn't appear but if it does snow I hope we are able to share some pictures of your snow sculptures next week.

The DfE have amended the Education (School Day and School Year) (England) Regulations to reduce the 2021/22 school year for maintained schools by one day to account for this additional Bank Holiday. This reduces the number of pupil contact days from 190 to 189.
