This week we have had a lot of visitors, but one thing that they have all said is how impressed they are by the learning behaviours in the classroom by the children. I know that when I was showing a visiting Headteacher around I was very proud of them all, they were working hard, asking questions and enjoying their lessons.

At the end of the week Key Stage 2 held the first of their sessions where parents were able to take part on a lesson with their children. There was some very impressive pasta making in Y3 where they used the skills that they had been learning throughout the topic. In Y5 adults and children joined together in an Art lesson where they created their own painted version of an object from nature inspired by William Morris prints. The children chose a small section of a print and sketched an enlarged outline before painting blocks of colour and adding finer details.

Key Stage 1 were also joined by a visiting author, where they listened to the author reading the book, were able to complete work about the book and they were even given a signed copy of the book. The best bit about this visiting author was that it was our very own Mrs Judge who has written the first of a series of books about Charlie's Zoo with a story about Elliot the Elephant. We are very proud of her and hope to have her talk to us about many more books in the series.

Next week is half term and time for a well-earned rest for everyone, but I am sure that the children will soon be looking for something to do. 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
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Teacher Strikes:
