Dear Parents & Carers,

This week the staff and children have enjoyed the activities and events that are beginning to start up again. Girls and boys from years 5 and years 6 took part in their first match since September. Thank you to Mr Flynn who has been contacting schools in order to set up this terms fixtures. We have fixtures set now at nearly one a week, which I know the children will be excited about.

You would have seen from our recent Ofsted report that the curriculum development is a focus area. I was extremely proud and impressed to listen in on a meeting between Mr Allen, Mrs Garnhan, Mrs Cox and our School Improvement Partner. The development of our History, Art and Science curriculum is moving quickly and teachers will be working from this curriculum from next term. These staff will be supporting other subject leads in developing their own area.

Some of you have spoken to me about the situation in the Ukraine. You have asked if we are collecting items; there are a number of collection points in Stevenage and they have secured transport to Ukraine. You have also expressed a concern about children discussing the situation in school. It is important that we do not ignore the situation but at the same time I understand that this needs to be done in an age appropriate way. Staff discussed this and Mr Yates will be sending out information, which will help you understand what we are doing and how you can support your children.

Yesterday, we celebrated 'World Book Day' by discussing our favourite books and thinking about authors. The children had the opportunity to hear their class teachers reading their favourite stories in year groups. We thoroughly enjoyed seeing the variety of costumes the children were wearing.
