Dear Parents & Carers,

At school this week, we have been focusing on books and reading. We had a book fair run by Usbourne Books where the children were able to purchase books, the money raised will help support the school to buy new books. You have also supported the 'Ready Steady Read', the total raised as of yesterday was £495.00.

Ms Ruprai has been introducing an updated phonics program, which will support children's' early reading skills, and purchasing books will address one of our involvement points in the recent Ofsted report. She has secured a grant for £6,000 towards this. We still need to raise some money for books and KS2. The Friends of Ashtree and some of the staff have challenge me to do a sponsored bungee jump to raise money for these books! 
Unfortunately, we lost the game 17-1, but potential for the Ashtree squad is amazing.
