This week the staff have been continuing to work on our curriculum. This time really focussing on the Early Years curriculum, the OFSTED report talked about how this also needed to be more detailed and sequenced. Miss Sinnott the Early Years Lead, Mrs Garnham the Art Lead and Mrs Cox the Science Lead met with our Early Years Advisor to start on this. Staff will start to teach this new curriculum in the Summer term, and it will be posted to the website so that you can see what your children will be learning.
