Dear Parents & Carers,

This week I have had the pleasure of visiting classrooms and seeing what the children are learning.

In Year 2 with Mrs Khan, the children were having an English lesson, where they were looking at similes and description. They had listened to a story about a dragon and then drawn their own dragon creation. They were then writing descriptions; the children had created a whole range of dragons from fierce and frightening ones to colourful and pretty ones.





In Year 4 Mrs Cox was explaining the difference between analogue and digital clocks. The children were learning about how to tell the time on the two different devices and about the 12-hour clock. They were keen to tell me that although a digital watch is easier to read, they preferred an analogue watch face.

In Year 6 one class were using the English lesson to revise for their SATs tests which are coming up and having a go at comprehension practice. The children were very clear about how helpful it has been to do the comprehensions in class with the support of the staff, they said that it has really helped to build their confidence and ability.

In the other class the children and Mr Yates were enjoying the new books that Ms Ruprai bought with the money raised by the PTA at the book fair.

In Reception the children were working on their phonics, Miss Sinnott was modelling 'ear' with the class. The children sounded out words; said the whole word; they read sentences and talked about the meaning of the words. They ended by writing the words onto their frames. Ms Ruprai has been working with the English Hub to make sure that we are making the best use of the Little Wandle phonics program that they have helped us to purchase with a £6000 grant. This was another Ofsted improvement point that the staff at Ashtree have enthusiastically taken on board.

I am very proud of the staff who are dedicated to meeting the improvement points from Ofsted and the children for adapting to the changes in our curriculum and delivery.


