Dear Parents & Carers,

As the weather continues to look and feel more like Autumn we have been starting to plan some of the usual Autumn events. It is only when I look back to last year that I remember how many were unable to go ahead in the usual way.

This year we will be having a traditional Harvest with donations. For some of us the cost of living has hit hard and I wanted to remind you that donations are completely voluntary. However, we have 311 children and over 50 adults at Ashtree, if we all bring in one item we will be able to make a beautiful display.

This year we will be sending most of the donations to The Food Shed <a href="http://www.stevenage-vineyard.co.uk/compassion/foodshed/">http://www.stevenage-vineyard.co.uk/compassion/foodshed/</a> a food bank that can be accessed by those in need of a bit of help with buying food. They do have a Facebook page that lists the items most needed right now but they will always be able to use tins of meat, veg, potatoes and fruit, cereal, biscuits, UHT milk, tea and coffee.

Some of our Year 6 children will hopefully also be taking some Harvest goodies along to the residents at Woodlands View. Prior to Covid this was a very enjoyable experience during which the children took packs of tea, coffee and biscuits, talked to the residents about their lives and often found someone who had lived in Stevenage all of their life. With our first value each year being Community it is very important that we help and share stories and experiences within our wider community and Harvest is a perfect time to do this.

Once we have booked in a visit to Woodlands View we will let you know how and when to bring in your donations.

During October we will be having our school photographs, again I really hope that this will be an occasion that is back to normal and we aim to have younger pre-school siblings in the photos too. The office is working hard to arrange the finer details and the information will be out to you soon.

Mixed aged classes have been a new way of working at Ashtree this year and senior leaders, middle leaders and subject leaders have spent time looking at the planning, talking to children and seeing what is happening in classes. I would like to say a huge thank you to the staff for the hard work that has gone into making sure that

all of the children are learning at the right level, enjoying their classes and mixing well outside. I know that it is always a pleasure to go into the classrooms or pass children in the corridor and be greeted with a happy smile and a cheerful 'Hello Mrs Janes'. If you still have questions about the way that this works or what your child is specifically doing, please come and talk to the class teacher, the phase leaders (Miss Sinnott or Mrs McQueen) or me. I know that it can be difficult to settle into something new and we want to reassure you and answer your questions so that you are as confident as us that this works for your child.
