Dear Parents & Carers,

This week I have had the chance to walk around classes again and see what is happening in the school.

I visited Year 2 at the start of the week where they were learning about classifying objects as living, dead or never lived. This resulted in some very interesting conversations with the children trying to explain their answers which can be a little complicated. I wonder what answer you would give if you tried to classify a table? Do we say that it is dead because it is made of wood and wood comes from trees or never lived because as a whole table it never has been a living table? I was very impressed with the Y2's and the way that they thought hard about their answers.

On Wednesday the whole of KS1 went on a school trip, they chose a very hot day but took plenty of water and hats and made sure that the children sat in the shade regularly. I spoke to some of the Year 1 children about the trip and this is what they told me.

I visited the Nursery at the end of the week where they had been looking at Transport. They were watching a video about types of transport and they had been talking about the different places that they had been in cars, busses or trains. They read 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt' and did the actions. Reading stories and adding actions is a lovely way to engage your children with books, reading the same story over and over again may seem repetitive but it helps your child to learn the pattern of the story and help them join in.

Some of the Early Years team attended training which was very useful. It talked about the importance of communication, talking to and listening to children. We learnt about how talk supports brain development as well as vocabulary and language. 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
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#### **Outside Achievements:**
