Geography & History:

This week, I have had the chance to look at some of the wonderful History and Geography work across the school. In EYFS, children have been learning about time periods including now and next. This has progressed moving to the different days of the week, months and the four seasons.

In KS1, Y1 and Y2 children have produced some excellent work about some different explorers including Christopher Columbus and Neil Armstrong. Y1 children were keen to point out that Christopher Columbus was not the nicest explorer at all! Children in Y1 have also shown good understanding of climate zones.

In KS2, Y3 children have just finished looking at Roman Britain and how they built roads and introduced coins to our country. Y4 have investigated the Ancient Egyptians earlier this year and it was very interesting reading about the mummification process. In class, they even had a chance to mummify some different fruits!

Year 5 children have been investigating the Victorians this term and it was amazing to see some of the discussions and research about school life. Some of the children were shocked to learn about consequences of bad behaviour at school during the Victorian times. Y5 have also looked at the water cycle, including some great explanations of floods and how they can impact us. Y6 children have explored the different biomes that can be seen in the Americas during their Geography this year. Children explained their work well and used diagrams to support their explanations.

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Y6 PGL:

The Year 6s, who came to PGL, amazed us with their awesome teamwork, bravery, and enthusiasm whilst away. Pupils pushed themselves out of their comfort zones by facing their fear of heights, challenging themselves to take the next step and were fantastic role models for Ashtree. All staff thoroughly enjoyed their week away with them and everyone has wonderful memories of a brilliant week.

Reading Rangers:


