### Next half term our school value is Celebrating Success

Dear Parents & Carers,

What a busy week this has been! On Monday we were visited by Martin Galway the HfL English advisor who supported subject leaders to plan our next steps in developing reading, writing and phonics across the school. Next year Mrs Garnham will be leading on writing, Mrs Cox on reading and Miss Sinnott on phonics. After school we held our Open Evening and it was lovely to see so many of you there, the staff told me that they enjoyed talking to you all and answering questions about the new classes next year. It was also a chance to talk to some of the support services and activity groups in and around Stevenage. It is very important to me that we make our Open Evening about the wider community as well as about our school. I know that many of you talked to Homestart for advice for younger children, BeeZee Bodies for healthy life styles, found out about Fit Fed and Read and Brighter Days. Stevenage Library was also there to highlight the Summer Reading Challenge which we will be taking part in, again this year. You can find out more here <https://summerreadingchallenge.org.uk/>

On Wednesday we welcomed Anne Peck and our new Hertfordshire Improvement Partner Dominic Bedford, came to talk to us about the progress that we have made since the Ofsted inspection and to look in depth at Science. Ms Ruprai was able to talk about the impact that the new phonics program, Little Wandle, is having and about the new books that she has bought to support phonics, along with the books bought for KS2 from the sponsor money. Mrs Cox impressed everyone with the work that she has been doing on developing our Science curriculum. We were able to visit classrooms and see the staff teaching from the new curriculum and show how the focus on specific Science learning points and scientific vocabulary has supported teaching and in turn helped the children to make progress. As always, the stars of the day were your children. Both of our visitors spoke highly of the children's manners and ability to talk about their learning. We were able to visit the Nursery where they were looking at life cycles, in Y2 they were learning about habitats and finding out what animals can be found in woodlands and urban areas, in Year 3 they were using torches and discussing the terms opaque, translucent and transparent. When we asked the children in Y3 what they were doing they were all able to clearly explain not only the activity but also the definitions of the terms. In Year 6 they were using Mr Men and Little Miss characters to think about genetic inheritance of characteristics and they came up with some interesting new characters that they thought might be the children of particular Mr and Miss Characters.

On Thursday we were visited in order to review the way we use Pupil Premium funding. This was another very successful visit looking at the teaching and learning and talking to children about the support that they get in school. Pupil Premium funding is an amount of money that comes into school, worked out from the number of children that have applied for free school meals, that can be used to support children's learning and wellbeing. It really helps the school when parents apply for free school meals, no matter what year group your child is in. This year the money has provided extra phonics sessions, extra staff in class, books and resources, our School Family Worker and therapy sessions to mention just a few things. Thursday also brought visits from the Herts for Learning Early Years advisor Rose Blair, who talked with Miss Sinnott about her plans for next year and the adaptations we are making for the mixed aged classes. Mr Yates our Maths lead was visited by Siobhan King the HfL Maths Lead.



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It has been very reassuring to hear all of the positive comments from our visitors about how much progress the school has made since December, I know that the staff are all working very hard to move our school forward and making the school experience for everyone a successful one.
