Welcome to this week's newsletter.

### School Arrangements 19 July – 21 July

Following the government's Step 4 announcements, I can confirm that we will be following the DFE guidance that schools open at Step 4 can continue with existing measures to the end of term. The only change to this will be parents/carers not having to wear masks when dropping off and collecting from the school playground from the 19 July. We respectfully ask that any parents/carers visiting school for meetings during these 3 days wear a mask when inside school unless medically exempt.

During Step 4 if anyone in school develops covid 19 symptoms, however mild, they will be sent home and asked to following public health advice.

### Breakfast Club (7.55am – 8.55am)

I am pleased that from September we can offer our usual 32 places at Breakfast Club. This is based in the Junior Dining Room during term times. Please contact Mrs Marlor on 07583615465 to book your sessions as we will have to turn you away at the door, without a booking. Mrs Marlor has asked that children arrive by 8.15am when breakfast is served. £3.75 a session or £3.25 per child if more than one sibling attends.

If you would like to register for breakfast club, please collect a registration form from the school office, you need to register to attend breakfast club. If you do not attend your booking you will still need to pay unless breakfast club is notified in advance. Thank you.

### **Sports Day**

This year Sports Day will again look different. Due to risk assessments and current guidelines we will not be inviting Parents/Carers on site. On Monday 19 July pupils across the school will have the opportunity, in their bubbles, to enjoy races on the track as part of an extended PE lesson. Could all pupils please wear PE Kit on Monday 19 July. Lunchtime arrangements will be as for a normal day.

### **Summer Reading Challenge - Wild World Heroes**

Hertfordshire are currently preparing for this year's summer reading challenge – Wild World Heroes. Every year the Reading Agency oversees this exciting programme, which is run by library staff. It starts on Saturday 10th July and runs until Saturday 4th September. This summer, children will help six fictional characters - 'wild heroes' who live in the town of 'Wilderville'. As they read library books, children will collect transformation stickers to add to a foldout town map, fixing the environmental problem in each area and making Wilderville a better home for everyone.

Research shows that children's reading can 'dip' during the long holidays and this can cause them to lose confidence when they return to school. The summer reading challenge encourages children to get into libraries and helps them keep up their reading skills. By providing fun reading activities this summer the challenge will also play a key role in supporting reading catch-up after a difficult year. It is the UK's biggest promotion of reading for children – in 2019 20,897 children took part in Hertfordshire – and it's free. Children are challenged to read six library books, eBooks or eAudiobooks of their choice during the holidays. For every two books they read they are rewarded with a set of stickers. When they have completed the challenge, they will receive a bookmark, certificate and medal. The summer reading challenge materials are suitable for visually impaired children.

### Notification of Positive Tests



Please notify school immediately if your child receives a positive Covid test. This can be done by phone or by emailing the school email address - [admin@ashtree.herts.sch.uk](mailto:admin@ashtree.herts.sch.uk), at any point including over the weekend. Your child will then have to isolate for 10 days. If an adult in the family home receives a positive Covid test your child should isolate for 10 days. If your child shows symptoms they should isolate at home until they have received a negative test or for 10 days from onset of symptoms.

### Government Home Lateral Flow Tests

These tests should only be used if you or your child is free from Covid symptoms. If the LFT is positive this must be followed up with a PCR test and your family must isolate until the PCR result comes back negative. If you or your child have symptoms ie. cough or high temperature, then you must get a PCR test or isolate for 10 days before your child returns back to school.
