This week Mr Yates, Mrs Cox and I were pleased to be able to show our Improvement Partner around the school to see what we do in Science. We thoroughly enjoyed talking to the children about their work. They told us all about the investigations they were doing, the knowledge they had learnt and what they remembered learning in other year groups. When we went into Year 4 they were learning about how the teeth grind up the food using a potato masher, in Year 3 they were learning about metamorphic rock by putting pressure and heat onto sweets to join them all together. Year 1 have been learning about carnivores, herbivores and omnivores, look out for next week's newsletter to find out more.

The children's behaviour and manners during the day was exemplary and the adults were all very impressed. Well done to Mrs Cox who is our Science Leader and all the staff and children. We had a practise fire drill this week, which went well and I even managed to turn the fire alarm off afterwards!

In **Year 2** - We have been learning about The Great Plague of 1665. This person is a plague doctor. Would you like to visit this doctor? We sketched a picture using different methods of shading.







Our **Year 5** - Topic in Science is Forces. In the lesson about water resistance, they experimented with different shapes to discover how streamlined shapes reduce water resistance and how bouyancy (upthrust) helps keep a boat afloat.

In the next lesson, they will make parachutes to investigate air resistance.
