Dear Parents & Carers,

On 10 October 2022 it is World Mental Health Day, we are asking the children to **'wear yellow'** to mark this important day. Mental ill health can affect anyone, no matter what age, background or place in their life, and it is something that is not always easily spoken about. This year during Hello Yellow day we will be asking everyone to wear something yellow, that might be your whole outfit or one item of clothing. All it takes is a kind word to make someone feel noticed and raise their self-esteem. This week I came into my office to find a card from Belle Y2, it was purple (my favourite colour) and said 'thank you for everything you do for us we appreciate it', that definitely made me smile. There are lots of things that the children can do both at home and school to 'make a donation', a kind word, a compliment, picking up a piece of rubbish even if it isn't theirs, letting someone join in their game or asking about how their weekend was. I look forward to seeing all of the smiles around school on Hello Yellow Day.

Something that we are doing to help at break times and lunchtimes is to talk to the children about the positive games that they can play and the ways that we expect them to behave. The staff have been making sure that we have consistent expectations and that the children know what they are. I spoke to you last year about the Zones of Regulation, a tool to support children to recognise how they feel and to teach them ways to move from the Red Zone to the Green Zone. This term's value of Community also backs up the idea that we all have a responsibility for making the playground a positive, enjoyable and safe space. Over the next year we will talk to you more about what we are doing to support the children at lunchtime, I would like to say thank you to Miss Hursey for her donation of books and Lego for our indoor lunchtime activities, having a variety of things to do indoors and outside helps the children to play positively.



In assembly every Friday we hand out a cup to the class that has the highest attendance that week. As a guide 95% is a good level of attendance, whilst we understand that there may be times when the children are unwell and need to recover at home, it is important that holidays and other unauthorised days of absence are kept to a minimum. The Governors ask for an attendance report at regular meetings because they like us, think that coming into school regularly is very important. Each term they award an attendance cup to the class with the highest overall attendance. This week the winner was Eagles 97.9%.
