This week class photos have been underway. There are some really creative photos of your children in their classes, and I can't wait to see the final results. Keep a look out for information about how to order the photos.

With Feeling Good Week taking place here at school I wanted to show you some of the ways that we help the children to feel good and feel calm. We use something called Zones of Regulation. In this you have four colours to help children to describe emotions Red, Yellow, Green, Blue. We are very careful not to talk about bad emotions but to focus on supporting children to recognise how they feel in different situations and how to regulate those emotions. In every class we have a Regulation Station, this is somewhere that children can reflect, think, or identify how they are feeling.



We have also been making good use of the sensory room with PTA funded resources. This is a lovely calm space for children to reflect or regulate their emotions.

I know that everyone enjoyed the yoga sessions, it was lovely to walk through the hall to see and hear the children taking part in breathing exercises and stretches, listening to calming sounds and making their own sounds. Thank you to Mrs McQueen for organising this.

#### School Holiday Free School Meal Vouchers - Mr Yates

All pupils who are eligible for benefit-related Free School Meals will be sent a £15.00 voucher on Monday 12 February. In addition, this will be the last school holiday voucher available in its current format. Please read the information that the Hertfordshire County Council have shared with the school below:

Since December 2020 the Local Authority have issued vouchers to families, funded through various government funding streams. Since October 2021 this has been funded through the Household Support Fund, a Department of Work and Pensions (the 'DWP') cost of living support fund. During and following the Chancellor's Autumn Statement in November, no commitment to the extension of the Household Support Fund (HSF) beyond the end of March 2024 was announced.

Whilst it is recognised that the Government continues to keep all its existing programmes under review, in the absence of a clear commitment to extend the fund beyond the end of March 2024, we are mobilising plans to end the holiday food voucher scheme.

We acknowledge that as the scheme has been running for the last 3 years this will have a significant impact on Hertfordshire residents. As it stands the last official food voucher will be the February half term voucher which will be ordered by schools from Thursday 1 February of £15.00.

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This week has been Hertfordshire's Feeling Good week. This year's theme is Regrown. The Year 6 school counsellors and Mrs McQueen have worked extremely hard to win the bid of £500 from Hertfordshire. Mrs McQueen has spent the money on the yoga classes that were delivered by Happy Little Yoga and trees, plants, and seeds for the children to plant around the school grounds.





Tuesday 6 February marked Safer Internet Day, a time to reflect on the importance of keeping our children safe online. The theme this year was 'Inspiring change? making a difference, managing influence and navigating change online'. Over the last 2 weeks in singing assembly Miss Hembra has been teaching the children a song called 'Be Safe' a song about internet safety. In class the children have had class assemblies discussing Safer Internet Day. They discussed how online content can change people's thoughts, feelings, and behaviour both positively and negatively. Various activities were completed throughout the school including completing the following statement 'To inspire change this Safer Internet Day I will...' Answers included not to complete dangerous challenges and not to follow people who are unkind. Some children created influencer profiles and wrote some positive messages that their influencer might say for example 'everyone is amazing just believe!'.

In an age where technology is woven into the fabric of daily life, it's crucial to empower our kids with the knowledge and tools to navigate the digital world safely. Please take this opportunity to have conversations about online risks, privacy settings, and responsible digital behaviour. 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**Pupil Premium Grant** is funding to improve educational outcomes in schools. We use a wealth of evidence of 'what works' when planning and reviewing our strategy (on school website). Our strategy has focused on high-quality teaching through staff professional development with a key focus on high quality texts and fidelity to our phonics program-Little Wandle. Little Wandle is supporting children to secure their foundations to reading. Our high-quality texts are reflected in our curriculum, particularly in English. Alongside this, we have put an emphasis on the key vocabulary introduced to children in all subjects from Nursery to Year Six. A recent visit from our District Schools Effectiveness Advisor who noted the emphasis placed on vocabulary using our recent purchase of Widgets. Our PTA have supported our vision through raising additional funds to support the purchase of high-quality texts and Widgets. Our strategy is reviewed annually and is improving outcomes for all our Ashtree children.

- support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- the guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
