Dear Parents & Carers,

This week I have been visiting classes and asking the children about what helps them learn. It was lovely to see how openly and knowledgably they talk about all the strategies they have.

I spent a lot of time on Year 5 and Year 6 because they were keen to show me their working walls. At Ashtree classrooms have a working wall for most subjects, this has helpful vocabulary, methods, and definitions that they have previously learnt. They told me that these walls really help them to remember methods taught in Maths, with examples and explanations on display. They told me that the walls help them to 'concentrate on solving the problem'.

They spoke about the resources around the classroom, and how they can choose which apparatus might help in Maths or which word mat might help them in English. Sometimes the important learning in an English lesson is how to use the word not to remember the word and word mats can help them with this. One child told me that 'my sentences are much better when I use a word mat and then next time, I can use the word without the mat'.

One class told me about their Jotter, a book to jot down notes about subjects in one lesson to be used to make future work even better.

I also asked them about what makes it harder to learn, they told me 'the bees in the summer getting in the classroom' and 'when it is really sunny outside'

So, they like to give me a challenge to solve!

I would like to thank all of the children that spoke to me this week, it is always a pleasure walking around the classrooms and hearing what the children think and feel.
