

Later in the week I met with Ms Goode, and we looked at how our DT curriculum helps children to develop those skills as they move through the school. She was very impressed with how much progress children have made now that we have introduced Little Wandle our phonics scheme. Miss Sinnott is our Phonics Lead and whenever I visit their classroom the children show me their sticker on their arm which has a word or sounds that they are learning at the moment. They also have a 'password' that they read each time they leave the room.

Next week is half term, there will some work happening in the school during the week to finish installing our new smoke detectors.
