Dear Parents & Carers.

It has definitely been a long half term for everyone and the children and the staff are ready for their half-term break.

I know that for many of you the Covid cases rising nationally and locally has been a concern. Although we have had to move to our contingency plan and bring in extra measures for some classes and some events, we are doing extremely well and managing to keep numbers low, keep everyone safe and still have a few events happening throughout the school. I would like to say thank you to you all for being patient when we send your children home for a test, letting us know promptly when children are showing symptoms or PCR results are back. It is important that we continue to work together to keep transmission rates low.

This week we have had a focus on early reading. This has involved Miss Ruprai, Mr Yates, Our Improvement Partner and I seeing phonics teaching, talking to children and hearing them read. This was another successful visit where we were able to show the hard work that goes on in Ashtree School. We also managed to have a face-to-face Parent Consultation evening this week. It has been a while since we have had parents into school on this scale and I wanted to say thank you for working with us to follow the slightly different rules for these meetings. We managed one-way systems and conversations distanced and masked and were still able to talk about your child and see some work.

We also had a very successful PTA AGM, even if it was sometimes hard to hear each other with masks and being spread out across the room! There are some fantastic ideas being discussed, some that will happen as restrictions ease and some that can happen straight away. The PTA is one way for you as parents to have a voice in the way that things develop in our school. Raising money is very important but I know that the team are also looking at ways that parents can be involved in our community in ways other than just for fundraising. Thank you everyone for your part in making this work.

This term the value that we have been focussing on is Community and we have certainly developed the sense of community with the development of the new PTA, the new style of the newsletter and in classes through our PSHE curriculum. Next half term the value will be **Respect** so keep an eye out on how we will be introducing this theme.

Finally, I would like to say thank you to all of the staff for their hard work this half-term, sometimes with fewer staff in the room than they expected due to staff isolating. It has been a very busy half-term and I have not really had time to think about it being my first as Headteacher. Thank you to you all for the support and messages of congratulations, I know that the staff and I appreciate the emails or words of thanks and praise that we have had this half-term. Enjoy your break and we will see you all safe and well on Tuesday 2 November.

This week we have introduced Sensory Circuits for our pupils. These have really helped settle pupils first thing in the morning, after break or lunch, or as some afternoon physical activity.

The circuits are made up of three stages: alerting - organising - calming. The alerting section allows children to release some energy; the organising section requires motor-sensory input processing through activities such as balancing; and the calming section provides input to ensure the children are calm and centred ready to return to class.





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For the past two weeks the children in **Year 1** have been learning about orchestras in their music lesson. Mrs Dunlop brought in real instruments from the woodwind and string section for the children to hold and touch. We have listened to the sound each one makes and spoke about the different sounds they create. They have also learnt what job a conductor does.

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
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
Favourite Books
