Dear Parents & Carers,

Welcome back, I hope that you all had a lovely break over the half term.

Here at school, we have been very busy with a few building and site works taking place. If you walk around the side of the building between the car park and the KS2 playground you will have seen the new fire escape. This is now a much more hardwearing model that will be secure for years to come. We also had three sets of fire doors and the surrounding panels replaced, this now looks very smart, and I must admit that the noise they make when they open and close has me thinking of the Star Trek doors! Work is continuing on the fire alarm and smoke alarms around the school, ensuring that the building and our community remain safe.

Outside we have had some work on two very large trees, one that was beginning to look top heavy and one where the roots were causing problems with the drains.

It was lovely to hear them not only talk about their own families coming into school but to mention how they had heard about the activities that other classes has been doing and that they looked forward to being able to do these as they move up the school.

It is always a pleasure to talk to the children around our school, they feel comfortable talking not only about what they enjoy but how we could do even better. They all said that they would like to see some clubs that were not sports, like computing club and cookery clubs in the future.

I would like to say thank you to the staff for the new parent open evening that they ran on Wednesday this week. Thank you to the staff from EYFS and KS1 for showcasing such inviting environments and giving new parents and children a taste of the learning that they do. Thank you to the staff from around the school that came along to help. Some of us were again left feeling quite old as we showed around parents that turned out to be children that we taught. This is one of the things that keeps us here at Ashtree, the feeling of community.
