This week the focus for the Behaviours for Learning trophy has been the Pride element of our classroom rules. Lessons are for Learning. To help us learn we... keep our work neat, keep our classroom tidy and take care of our things. Everyone has been working hard at this, and by the end of the week I couldn't find anything that needed tidying up and I saw some lovely examples of neat work. The children have particularly been showing how much the handwriting intervention has been working giving them beautiful, neat handwriting in their books.

World Book Day was a cozy event with everyone coming in in pyjamas and slippers. There was extra reading in the classrooms, book displays around the corridors encouraging children to 'read something new' and themed lessons in class. At the end of the day the PTA gave out the free World Book Day books to everyone that came along. If you didn't make it don't worry because the teachers have the spare books, and everyone should be able to get one.

Parent Consultations are coming up and the letter will be out soon letting you know the arrangements. Some classes have more than one teacher leading them so look carefully at the days on the letter of you need to see someone in particular.

In last week's newsletter we asked for anyone that was interested in becoming a parent governor. We have more than one vacancy so please do contact Mr Lawson if you are interested. Becoming a school governor is a wonderful and rewarding experience and will allow you to use your skills to have a positive impact on the education of the children. There is no requirement for you to have an educational background and we welcome applications from any background if you are prepared to take on the commitment of the voluntary role. Meetings are held each half term in the evenings and there is some expectation that you will be able to attend meetings during the day. Full training will be provided. Our Chair of Governors, James Lawson or Vice Chair, Juliet Whitehead will be happy to have an informal chat with you about being a Governor. Finally, you will have heard on the news recently the focus on attendance by the Department for Education. Attendance in school is vital to your child's development. The DFE quoted that *data also shows that in 2019, primary school children in Key Stage 2 who didn't achieve the expected standard in reading, writing and maths missed on average four more days per school year than those whose performance exceeded the expected standard.*

Did you know that 90% attendance means that your child is absent from lessons for the equivalent of one-half day every week. Over five years this is the equivalent of about one half of a school year. There will always be valid reasons for not being in school, we ask as a school that where your child has been sick, they stay away from school for 48 hours, and we certainly don't want to be spreading illnesses such as Chicken Pox around the classes. However, unauthorised absences such as holidays in school time, persistent illnesses and unexplained absences may result in a fine or the need to show proof of illnesses. Staff work extremely hard to plan your child's learning experiences please support us by bringing your child into school whenever they are well and informing the office of the reasons when they are not.
