On Monday Anne Peck, our Improvement Partner and Siobhan King a Maths advisor with Hertfordshire visited us for Learning. Sally Barber our Maths Lead came with us and we were all very impressed by the teaching and learning taking place. Teachers are working hard to identify any gaps in learning from last year's lockdowns and to address them in class. The children, as always, did us proud and spoke clearly, honestly and enthusiastically about, their Maths work, and even managed to drop in a few pieces of information about what they had for dinner, and how much they enjoyed their Science lesson.

Our visitors commented on how the children enjoy their learning in mathematics. They found that children in years 2, 4 and 6 were especially articulate about what they are learning and were willing and able to share what they had been learning today.

Later in the week, I was able to talk to some of the children that we did not get to see on the Monday. Laycie (Y5) brought me her book to show me how hard she has been working and was very proud to show me how much her work is improving. When I asked her what had helped her to improve, she said I got extra help from my teachers. When I started, I did not really get it but now I can do it on my own – Well done, Laycie.

The children also spent time this week reflecting on the meaning of Remembrance Day, which fits this half term's value of Respect very well. The children talked about the way that the two minutes silence is a sign of respect and remembrance, and how the day is marked around the world.

Next week, we will be wearing odd socks to reflect on anti-bulling week and the important messages of the theme of 'One Kind Word' and how important it is to show kindness and think about the impact that our words can have on others.

For those of you that are taking part in a Remembrance Day Parade this weekend, I hope that the weather is kind to you. Have a lovely weekend.




School Reminder:
