This included 'Story Raids', where our Year 6 Reading Ambassadors would go to a classroom unexpectedly and read a book to the class. We also had the book fair at the end of the day, run by our wonderful PTA, the Friends of Ashtree, who sourced the books and made it possible for each Ashtree pupil to receive two free books. It was fantastic to have so many children come and show me what books they had chosen. Many thanks to everyone who helped make this day a success.

Maths Update - Mr Yates

This week has been a very busy week of Maths at Ashtree. Year 6 have been exemplary when completing their mock SATS tests, which included three Maths papers. Year 3, 4 and 5 have also been completing Maths tests all week. These tests are for diagnostic purposes and allow teachers to see which concepts pupils have secured over the Spring Term, and which concepts pupils need revisiting.

In addition, I have been able to spend some time in Maths lessons with our younger pupils. Milly H in Year 2 explained how to use a tally chart to build a block graph of pupils' favourite colours; Oscar K in Year 1 showed me how to use Cuisenaire rods to represent the value of coins; and in the Early Years, Reggie G taught me how to play the Numicon game - ordering amounts from 1-5.

This week's whole school homework is based around numbers. The teachers are looking forward to seeing what calculations pupils can come up with based on what they can see in the pictures.



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Nursery & Reception

The children in Nursery and Reception have been looking at the story 'The Snail and the Whale'. We thought about all the different places the Snail and the Whale visited on their adventures together.

This week the Nursery children looked in closer detail at some of the cold places. The children have been learning about life in North and South Pole and how to prepare for a visit there. They have been busy sorting out suitable clothes and thinking about what they need to take that might be different from their usual school uniform.

The children in Reception have been looking at the humid jungle and thinking about how it is different to Stevenage. The reception children have compared the climates of both places, as well as animals and their habitats that we might encounter if we went there!
