Where are the classroom doors?



The Nursery classroom door is on the left hand side.



The Reception classroom door is on the right hand side.

The classroom doors are at the front of the school next to the main office. This is where you will drop off and pick up the children each day. If your child is in Nursery, we recommend you wait in the shared garden area. If your child is in Reception, we recommend you stand outside the main office.

Nursery Additional Optional Charges

Nursery AM only	Monday to Friday 8.45 – 11.45	Optional Lunch session: 11.45 – 12.30 £4.50 per lunch session
Nursery PM only	Monday to Friday 12.30 – 3.30	Your child is welcome to bring their own packed lunch but a cold school packed lunch is available for £2.45
Nursery 30 hours	Monday to Thursday 8.45 – 3.30 Friday 8.45 – 11.45 The times above complete your child's 30 hours entitlement. If you wish your child to spend Friday 11.45 -3.30 in Ashtree Nursery, then each Friday afternoon session will cost an additional £22.50.	Your child is welcome to bring their own packed lunch, but a cold school packed lunch is available for £2.45

All payments need to be made to the school a minimum of a week in advance.

What will my child need to bring to school in EYFS?



- ✓ A named book bag for every child, with reading record and reading book inside for Reception children once they have been issued in the Autumn term
- ✓ A named water bottle in school every day, even if your child is having milk.
- ✓ A named canvas bag with a spare change of clothes in case of any toilet accidents (If your child has a medical condition and is still in nappies please can you provide nappies, wipes and nappy sacks)
- ✓ The children need to come to school wearing their named PE kit (a white t-shirt and bottle green shorts/black joggers) on their PE day. This day is to be confirmed.
- ✓ Suitable outer clothing for the weather, e.g. sun hats in summer, welly boots in the rain and woolly hats in winter



School Uniform



- Named bottle green sweatshirt or cardigan
- Named white shirt/polo shirt
- Named grey or black trousers/shorts/skirts
- Long hair tied back
- Grey, black, white socks or tights
- Black outdoor shoes No laces
- Named Green summer dress







School Uniform - PE



- Named white T-shirt (logo optional)
- Named bottle green shorts/black jogging bottoms
- Named bottle green school sweatshirt
- Trainers without laces
- Long hair tied back

All children in <u>both</u> Nursery and Reception are required to come to school wearing their PE unform on their PE day.

We will let you know the PE days soon.

- •Items in school colours are available, without the school name or crest, from major high street shops.
- •We would ask that <u>all</u> clothing worn to school is marked with your child's name, so that any items which are lost can easily be returned to them.
- •Children should not wear any jewellery to school, however if it is required for religious observance or medical reasons please discuss this with the Headteacher.





School Dinners, Milk and Snack!



School Dinners

In Nursery should you wish your child to have a school packed lunch there will be a cost of £2.45 per lunch.

In Reception, every child is entitled to a free school dinner! The children can choose from a menu that will be shared with you.



Milk

In Early Years, all children are able to have milk for free until the term they turn 5 years old.



Snack

In Early Years every child is entitled to a free piece of fruit each day!



EYFS Merits and Challenge Stars!



Merits

In EYFS we operate a merit reward system. The children collect 10 merits on a rocket to earn a badge. The badges move through the colours of the rainbow.



Challenge Stars

In EYFS we actively encourage the children to challenge themselves. The children can collect challenge stamps on their own individual star.



We support learning at home in a variety of different ways

EYFS - How can you support your child at home?



Homework

In EYFS every child will receive homework once a week. This will alternate between the 'Whole School Homework' and an activity matched to their class based learning.

Homework is to be returned the following week.



Home Reading

In *Nursery* every child will be able to choose a library book once a week to take home for you to read to them.

In *Reception* every child will receive a home reading book to be kept in their school book bag. This book will be changed weekly on their reading day. It is absolutely vital you read with your child for a minimum of <u>4 times per week</u>. Please sign their reading record each time you read.

Breakfast Club



We are a friendly, relaxed club with many activities for the children.

We are open daily from 7.55am and children should arrive no later than 8.15am. The entrance is via the Junior Dining Room (same entrance as used for the School Discos).

The cost for each child is £3.75 per day.

If you have more than one sibling attending the cost will be £3.25 per child, per day. The Breakfast Club can be used on a regular basis, once a week or on a single occasion; however you must phone ahead to book a place as it is very popular and some sessions may be full.

We are always here to welcome the children during term time. We have a variety of breakfast cereals or toast followed by fruit and yoghurt. For drinks we serve milk, milkshakes or squash. We have occasional theme days, i.e.. Pancake day, hot cross buns at Easter, strawberries and cream during Wimbledon fortnight, etc.

At 8.45am we walk the Nursery children to their classrooms.

Keeping children safe is everyone's responsibility



- Children who are unwell
- If your child is unwell, it is important to contact the school office as soon as possible to let us know. If you child has been sick or has an upset stomach, they must stay home for a period of 48 hours.
- Medication
- You must inform the school if your child requires any type of medication during the school day. Please take any medication to the office and they will help you to complete a medical form.
- Individual medical needs
- It is vital for parents/carers to share information about their child's individual medical needs. The school will complete a Health Care Plan with you in order to keep your child safe
- We are a <u>NUT FREE</u> school and do not allow nut-based products in a child's packed lunch. If there are additional severe allergies within the class, we will inform you, so you are able to support us further.
