Key Vocabulary

to know that running stitch can be used to join fabrics. Joining and decorating fabrics with running stitch, glue, staples, over sewing, tape. To select and use tools and materials appropriate to the product

Skill: Join fabrics using running stitch, over sewing, back stitch. Use appropriate decoration techniques e.g. appliqué (glued or simple stitches)

Misconceptions

Do children know how to use scissors safely? • Can children cut lines accurately? • Can children cut out shapes accurately?

Can children sew two pieces of material together? • Can children use the tools needed for sewing safely and sensibly?

Tangling the thread, ensure the thread is not too long and chn can feel resistance before they sew back on themselves.
