Year 1 - Scultpure

Key Vocabulary

Smooth, scrape, slice, shallow cuts, deep cuts, texture, malleable, construct, rolling, pinching, kneading, surface, decorate, mark making

Prior Knowledge Key Knowledge

<u>Key Skills</u>

Children can be taught key knowledge by learning the skills below:

- 1. Manipulating and joining materials to create a 3D piece of art work
- 2. Experiment with a range of sculpting materials such as paper, papier mâché, playdough/plasticine, clay
- 3. Explore techniques such as kneading, rolling and shaping materials
- 4. Ask questions and describe what can be seen in a painting.
- 5. Ask questions about a piece of artwork

<u>Suggested Activities</u> (These can take as many CIL lessons as you need over the half term.)

- To explore different types of paper used in art – plain, card, sugar, tissue, crepe, newspaper etc.
- 2. Children to explore these paper types looked at from previous lesson and use them to make a collage based on Kandinsky tree pictures
- To create decorative artwork using tissue paper children could create a "stained glass window" picture.
- 4. Children to use card/paper strips to create small tubes/beads to begin making 3D objects that can be used as part of final project.

5/6 Use papier mache and tubes/beads technique from step 4 to make a paper sculpture based on Kandinsky trees artwork

Assumptions are made that children understand that sculpture is built up -3DAssumption that children know how to attach materials together using glue, clay, tape etc
