Prior skills:

- 1. To explore the human lifecycle
- 2. To identify some basic facts about puberty
- 3. To explore how puberty is linked to reproduction
- 4. To explore respect in a range of relationships
- 5. To discuss the characteristics of healthy relationships
- 6. Explain how friendships can make people feel unhappy or uncomfortable.

Prior knowledge:

- 1. Understand that puberty is an important stage in the human lifecycle
- 2. Know some changes that happen during puberty
- 3. Know about the physical and emotional changes that happen in puberty
- 4. Understand that children change into adults to be able to reproduce if they choose to
- 5. Know that respect is important in all relationships including online

Key Knowledge:

- 1. To understand male and female puberty changes in more detail
- 2. Understand how puberty affects the reproductive organs
- 3. To explore the impact of puberty on the body and the importance of physical hygiene
- 4. To know and explain how to keep clean during puberty
- 5. To know and explain how emotions/relationships change during puberty
- 6. Know how to get help and support during puberty

Key Skills:

- 1. To explore the emotional and physical changes occurring in puberty
- 2. Explain the main physical and emotional changes that happen during puberty
- 3. Ask questions about puberty with confidence
- 4. Describe what happens during menstruation and sperm production

<u>Future Knowledge:</u>

- 1. To consider puberty and reproduction
- 2. Know that communication and permission seeking are important
- 3. Know some basic facts about conception and pregnancy
- 4. Know positive and negative ways of communicating in a relationship
- 5. Know when it is appropriate to share personal/private information in a relationship
- 6. Know how and where to get support if an online relationship goes wrong
