Prior skills:

- 1. To explore the emotional and physical changes occurring in puberty
- 2. Explain the main physical and emotional changes that happen during puberty
- 3. Ask questions about puberty with confidence
- 4. Describe what happens during menstruation and sperm production

Key Knowledge:

- 1. To consider puberty and reproduction
- 2. Know that communication and permission seeking are important
- 3. Know some basic facts about conception and pregnancy
- 4. Know positive and negative ways of communicating in a relationship
- 5. Know when it is appropriate to share personal/private information in a relationship
- 6. Know how and where to get support if an online relationship goes wrong

Prior knowledge:

- 1. To understand male and female puberty changes in more detail
- 2. Understand how puberty affects the reproductive organs
- 3. To explore the impact of puberty on the body and the importance of physical hygiene
- 4. To know and explain how to keep clean during puberty
- 5. To know and explain how emotions/relationships change during puberty
- 6. Know how to get help and support during puberty

<u>Key Skills:</u>

- 1. Describe how and why the body changes during puberty in preparation for reproduction
- 2. Talk about puberty and reproduction with confidence
- 3. Explore the importance of communication and respect in relationships
- 4. Explain differences between healthy and unhealthy relationships
- 5. Consider different ways people might start a family
- 6. Describe the decisions that have to be made before having children

Future Knowledge in KS3:

- Strategies to manage the physical and mental changes that are a typical part of growing up, including puberty and menstrual wellbeing
- The importance and different forms of contraception; how and where to access contraception and advice
- That certain infections can be spread through sexual activity and that barrier contraceptives offer some protection against certain sexually transmitted infections
- The communication and negotiation skills necessary for contraceptive use in healthy relationships
- The risks related to unprotected sexual intercourse
- The consequences of unintended pregnancy, sources of support and the options available
