To research the meaning of animals and plants to represent characteristics for their strengths

To design a plaque to represent themselves with animals and plants in background just like the Benin king

To review how to cut animals from clay using templates or build up on a clay tile so it has pattern and is 3D

To make the plaque using clay - review joining techniques - how to make silt – this may need 2 lessons

Misconceptions

Children do not always make the link between 2 dimensional plans and 3d sculpture; the relationship between two dimensional shapes and three dimensional forms needs to be taught
